Student Comfort & Parent Provisions

We love to see those sweet little smiles; every child needs to feel comfortable and ready to learn each day!

- **Ensure** your child has breakfast EVERY morning. If they are not able to eat before making it to school, please inform your child's teacher and make adequate provisions. Please avoid giving junk food or candy in the mornings.
- **Daily must-haves** include extra or large water bottles, snacks, lunch packed neatly, an extra plate and cutlery for lunch and napkins.
- For the Early Years students, also include spare diapers, spare clothes, a small towel and wipes. Please take the time to label all personal items.
- Elementary students (Year 1 to 6) need to come with basic stationary pencils, pens, erasers, rulers, parsing pens/markers. (Occasionally, craft supplies may be requested by teacher). Homework helps children:


- Practice what they learn

Quick Checklist to Support Learning at Home:

- Set a calm, quiet space with basic supplies (crayons, pencils, erasers, rulers, sharpeners, colour pencils, scissors, glue and more)
- Let them try first-guide, don't give answers
- Praise effort, not just results
- · Stay calm and patient-even when it's challenging
- For younger children: read instructions, talk, sing, support difficulties, writing or scribbling and play to build early skills

Tardiness

Please avoid tardiness; model responsible behavior to your child by ensuring they are properly and neatly dressed and are punctual daily. See Uniform Schedule on next page and take note the following school hours:

· Arrival:

7:00am - 7:35am. Circle Time and Morning Assembly starts at 7:40am sharp. If your child is not in class at this time, YOU ARE LATE. Please ensure students arrive on time, as late arrivals disrupt the morning routine.

· Pickup:

Early Years: 2:30pm (Monday to Thursday) and

2:00pm (Friday)

Elementary: 3:30pm (Monday to Thursday)

and 2:00pm (Friday).

Late pickups beyond 20 minutes after closing

time will incur a fee.

Abscence

It is important to work together to ensure we make every moment matter...

What YOU must do:

- Try to call the school before 9:00am each day of your child's absence.
- Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments, events or travel plans that will require half day, full day or several days of absence.
- If your child is in good health but doesn't feel up to being in school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.
- If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

- · Check your child's attendance every day.
- Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.
- Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.
- If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.





Uniform Schedule

MONDAYS AND TUESDAYS

- Girls: Grey Shirt, Blue Skirt, Tie, Black Socks, Black Shoes.
- Boys: Grey Shirt, Blue Trousers, Tie, Black Socks, Black Shoes.
- Infants and Toddlers: Light Blue Polo Shirt, Jeans, White Sneakers.

WEDNESDAYS

- Girls: Pink Sportswear, White Socks, White Sneakers.
- Boys: Blue Sportswear, White Socks, White Sneakers.

THURSDAYS

All Students: Light Blue Polo Shirt, Jeans, White Sneakers.

FRIDAYS

All Students: Casual Clothes.

NOTE:

- The following are not allowed: Jewelry (except wrist watches), hair
 beads or small hair clips that can be ingested, coloured socks or
 coloured shoes (different from the stated black or white), coloured
 hair extensions (except black or brown).
- Come dressed neatly in the complete and correct uniforms daily.
